We are delighted that you have shown interest in our Organisation. Data protection is of a particularly high priority for the MemberWise Network.

This privacy notice explains how we process your personal information when you visit our website/register for our online community and if you choose to be a member of ours. It explains how we will protect data subjects {your} information and personal data, and the controls and safeguards we provide for this data. This includes understanding, at all times, precisely what data we are storing for and about you, who (if anyone) can see that data, and whether you give permission for that data to be shared with third-parties.

The processing of personal data, such as the name, address, e-mail address, or telephone number shall always be in line with the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), The UK Data Protection Act 2018 and the Privacy and Electronic Communications Regulations (PECR)

By means of this data protection declaration, we would like to inform you of the nature, scope, and purpose of the personal data we collect, use and process. Furthermore, data subjects are informed, by means of this data protection declaration, of the rights to which they are entitled.

Specific data protection declarations will be provided separately when you register for a MemberWise Event, or training session, which will allow for the nuances of such events to be communicated to you in a concise and transparent manner.

1. Who are we?

The MemberWise Network is both unique and different. It is an independent professional network that provides practical help and support to over 5,000+ membership organisation and association professionals based in the UK and overseas.

We are registered as a data controller (with the Information Commissioners Office, ICO) under registration number ZA298939.

2. The information we collect about you, why we need it and who it's shared with?

The personal data we collect will be used for the following purposes:

In order for us to provide you with membership and related services (including the signposting of network conferences, member & non-member research, events, products and/or services) we need to collect personal data for correspondence purposes and service provision. In any event, we are committed to ensuring that the information we collect and use is appropriate for this purpose and does not constitute an invasion of your privacy.

The legal basis for the processing of your personal data:

- Our legitimate interests as a data controller
- The processing is necessary to fulfil a contract/enter into negotiations for a contract
- Consent

Processing through use of our Legitimate Interests

Where the processing of personal data is based on Article 6(1) par. F of the GDPR, the legitimate interests we pursue are to carry out a business in favour of the well-being of all our members, employees, shareholders and for the good of the membership sector.

We consider that membership and association professionals rely on being kept up-to-date about new and existing products or services, as well as best practice advice in order to help them achieve their Organisational objectives.

Marketing is generally seen as an important tool, but we want to respect the wishes of you, the recipient of our marketing. Under GDPR you have an absolute right to object to direct marketing and if you wish to do so please contact unsubscribe@memberwise.org.uk. We have undertaken a balancing test to compare our legitimate interests versus your interests and indeed fundamental rights and freedoms under GDPR, which require the protection of your personal data.

We will only process your personal data on these grounds if we have determined that our services are 'professionally relevant' to you and your organisation. Material that we send to you may be relevant based on your profile, because of the type, size or location of the organisation that you work in, or because you are the right post-holder for a certain set of decisions based on factors like your role, seniority, and responsibilities.

We believe that the recipients of our marketing have a reasonable expectation that MemberWise will process their Personal Data,

Our assessment has considered the technical and organisational security measures that the MemberWise Network has implemented and the safeguards we now have in place in readiness for GDPR.



MemberWise routinely conducts Data Protection Impact Assessments with risk mitigation outputs that may include:

- data minimization
- de-identification
- privacy by design and default
- adding extra transparency
- additional layers of encryption
- multi-factor authentication
- data retention limits
- restricted access
- an opt-out preference
- anonymization
- encryption, hashing, salting
- other technical security methods used to protect data

The likelihood of impact and the severity of negative impact of our processing on your data has been assessed and deemed to be negligible.

The data we hold about you may have originated from MemberWise conferences/events you have previously attended, or information you have supplied via the MemberWise Website or online community (MemberWise Connect).

Where we store information collected about you

We may transfer your information to our data processors within and outside the European Economic Area but will do so with appropriate measures and controls in place to protect that information in accordance with applicable data protection laws and regulations and regulatory guidance. In all instances, we will take into account the nature of the information we are transferring, and the level of protection provided by those processors.

Contractual Processing

Where the processing of personal data is based on the performance of a contract, then Members of the MemberWise Network agree that processing take place to fulfil an ongoing membership contract with its associated terms and conditions.

This means, for example, we will collect, store, structure and use your personal information for the transmission of digital communications related to the administration of your membership; for example essential communications such as the MemberWise Newsletter which is closely aligned with the MemberWise Mission Statement that you have signed up to:

Processing using Consent

There are certain circumstances, particularly in regards electronic marketing communications that fall within the Privacy and Electronic Communication Regulations; where we are likely to need consent from you in order to process your data.. If this is the case we will ensure that the consent that you provide is by a clear affirmative act establishing a freely given, specific, informed and unambiguous indication of your agreement to the processing of personal data relating to you.

When you visit this website, we will automatically collect the internet protocol (IP) address of the device used by you to visit this website as well as the type of the device, browser version and time zone setting. This will enable us to identify you as a unique user for analytical purposes and to optimise our website for your device. This data does not allow us to, and we will not attempt to use this data to, identify you.

4. Access to your personal data and rights to correct, restrict or delete that data

At any point while we are in possession of or processing your personal data, you, the data subject, have the following rights:

- Right of access – you have the right to request a copy of the information that we hold about you free of charge
- Right of rectification – you have a right to correct data that we hold about you that is inaccurate or incomplete.



- Right to be forgotten – in certain circumstances you can ask for the data we hold about you to be erased from our records.
- Right to restriction of processing – where certain conditions apply to have a right to restrict the processing.
- Right of portability – you have the right to have the data we hold about you transferred to another organisation.
- Right to object – you have the right to object to certain types of processing such as direct marketing.
- Right to object to automated processing, including profiling – you also have the right to be subject to the legal effects of automated processing or profiling.
- Right to judicial review: in the event that MemberWise refuses your request under rights of access, we will provide you with a reason as to why. You have the right to complain as outlined below

All of the above requests will be forwarded on should there be a third party involved in the processing of your personal data.

5. Other websites

On occasion our website will contain links to other websites. This privacy policy only applies to The MemberWise Network website. When you link to other websites you should read their own privacy policies.

Changes to our privacy policy

We keep our privacy policy under regular review and we will place any updates on this web page. This privacy policy was last updated on 3rd April 2018.

6. How long we keep information collected about you

Any information provided by you will be retained for as long as necessary in connection with the purposes for which it was provided, for example, to respond to your enquiry. In respect of any contact information stored within our customer relationship management (CRM) system, we will delete your details upon request and if we have not had any further communication with you within a period of three years.

Any information collected as part of an application for membership will be stored for the term of an individual's term of membership and 6 months thereafter.

Any information collected about you or your activity through the use of cookies will be retained for the time periods set out in the above table.

In any case, once we have processed any information about you in connection with the purposes for which it was provided or collected, we will securely delete or anonymise (to the extent such information was capable of identifying you in the first instance) such information upon expiry of the above time periods.

7. How to contact us in regards to your rights or make a complaint

In the event that you wish to make a complaint about how your personal data is being processed by MemberWise (or third parties above), or how your complaint has been handled, you have the right to lodge a complaint directly with the ICO and MemberWise's data protection representative.
